



Dedicated to Elizabeth Trevor (*ca.* 1713-1761), wife of the 3rd Duke of Marlborough; along with King George II she was a godparent to George, 2nd Earl Spencer. Although New Grove and BUC give a date of 1762 it would seem likely that the volume was printed before the Duchess's death in October 1761.






